THE INDIA Meteorological Department (IMD) has forecast a harsh and arid summer, with prolonged and more intense the country in April-Jun

ue country in April-June.
There is a high probability of heat wave episodes lasting as longas 10-20 days (against a normal of four-eight days) during the upcoming three months, the IMD said. Rainfall associated with prewith pre-monsoon conditions is expected to be below normal over most regions; aridity and shortage of water will add to the

shortage of water will add to the overall increased temperatures forecast for the season.
Rajasthan, Gujarat, Saurashtra-Kutch, Maharashtra, north Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh and Odisha are likely to see high day temperatures and heat waves. More importantly, there will be higher than normal bart waves cralls in April, lune heat wave spells in April-June the IMD warned.

"Most regions in the country will experience above normal will experience above normal maximum temperatures during the summer season this year, Jammu and Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, northern Odisha, ad-joining Gangetic West Bengal and eastern India regions could experience normal or below normal temperatures," said IMD Director General Mrutyunjay Mohanatra during the pelease of Mohapatra during the relea the temperature outlook for

the temperature outlook for April-June on Monday. The summer season will be-gin on a warm note with day temperatures during April likely to remain significantly high over Madhya Pradesh, north and coastal Maharashtra, Kamataka,

According to the IMD, heat wave spells lasting for two-eight days (against a normal of one-three days) are most likely to af-fect Andhra Pradesh, Saurashtra-Kutch Maharashtra and western regions of Madhya Pradesh thi onth. Pre-monsoon rainfall will be below average, mainly

will be Delow Average, Inlainly over coastal, eastern and south peninsular regions, thereby continuing the dry trend in these areas since February.

"We cannot attribute a single phenomenon for the prolonged heat wave spells. But during El Nino years, the number and intensity of heat waves remain higher than normal," Mohapatra

plained. The El Nino conditions — ab-The El Nino conditions — au-normal warming of the sea sur-face recorded along the equatorial Pacific Ocean — had commenced last June. After peaking in December last year, it began to ease but warm conditions con-tinue to prevail and significantly drive up global temperatures. El Nino conditions are known to suppress rainfall over India and in-

suppress rainfall over India and in-crease temperatures globally.
Multiple global climate mod-els have forecast that the ongo-ing ElNino conditions will wane and be replaced by El Nino Southern Oscillation (ENSO) neutral conditions by June, which sees the onset of India's southwest prospen. uthwest monsoon. During February-March, the

southernpeninsular region experienced hotter than normal rienced hotter than normal weather. Heat wave conditions were reported from Maharashtra. Northern Kamataka, Saurashtra-Kutch and parts of Rajasthan in late March. The maximum temperatures recorded during the past week reached 42.6 degrees Celsius

exise department has collected its highest ever revenue under the old excise regime, crossing the Rs 7,000 crore figure for the first time, said officials. According to data shared by the Delhi government, the depart-ment has collected revenue of Rs 7484 crore, which also includes excise revenue and Value Added Tax (VAT) on liquor in 2023-24. This is 10% higher than the Rs 6830 cms collected in 2022-31

6,830 crore collected in 2022-23. "This is the highest ever excise "Inis is the nignest ever excise revenue collection realised..." said a senior officer, adding that the number of liquor shops and brands have also increased in the past couple of years. The old excise regime was brought back afcise regime was prought back at-ter the AAP government scrapped its ambitious new liquor policy in 2022. Now, only government liquor shops can operate in Delhi.

and is taking necessary action. We will soon come up with an appropriate punishment for the ones responsible for this incident. We have also reached us to the Dean of Students for appropriate care and support to be given to the complainant and to ensure her safety," Kumar added.

In a statement, the union said, "_four people_were found harassing female students...in the presence of security guards. They were found harassing and using derogatory remarks directed at the students. JNUSU strongly condemns this act of sexual harassment."

Jaishankar too addressed a press conference, alleging that the DMK had "connived" with the Indira government on the issue.

What explains its focus?

The focus on Katchatheevu kills several birds with one stone for the BJP. It appeals to Tamil for the BJP. It appeals to Tamil sentiments in a state where regional pride carries much resonance, and has been a major obstacle in the efforts of the BJP, with it is nationalist agenda, to make innoads there.

DELHI CHIEF Minister Arvind Kejriwal, who was arrested by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) on March 21, has refused to resign

March 21, has rerused to resign from his post and is communicat-ing with his ministers on matters of governance from custody. While how the Delhi CM's ar-rest will impact the Aam Aadmi Party's chances in the Lok Sabha polls is something time will tell, here are a few examples of leaders who have won polls while in jail and of others whose incarperformance of their parties.

Lalu Prasad

In 1997, the CBI chargesheeted then Bihar CM Lalu Prasad in the fodder scam case. Facing a revolt within the Janata Dal over the allegations, Lalu floated the Rashtriya Janata Dal and resigned as CM, leaving the reins of the government to his wife Rabri Devi. He was then arrested by the CBI and spent 135 days in jail.

Renowned for acclaimed novels like 'Munpe Parakkunna Pakshikal' and

'Spandamapinikale Nandi', the Sey-gear-old stated that all mem-bers of the Akademi had protested when a Union minis-ter had participated in the organ-isation's annual festival and sub-sequently, assurances were n that this would not recur The Akademi runs as an au omous body under Ministry

No relief to Kerala, SC refers matter to constitutional bench

THE SUPREME Court on Monday refused to grant any interim re-lief to Kerala government on its plea challenging the limitations placed by the Centre on its bor-

A bench of Justices Surya Kant and K V Viswanthan concluded that the state itself had "admitted...that there has been over-borrowing]ower-utilization of the borrowing limit between he FYs. 2017-18 and 2019-20. It is not denied that if, as concruded by the bigon such overtended by the Union, such overborrowings are adjustable in the succeeding years, then the State has already exhausted its bor-rowing limits for the F.Y. 2023-24"

The court, however, said the matter "raises more than one substantial question regarding interpretation of the Constitution", including whether "Article 293 of the Constitution vest a State with an enforceable right to raise bor-rowing from the Union govern-

rowing from the Union govern-ment and/or other sources?" and "if yes, to what extent such right can be regulated by the Union government?". The court said that "since Article 293 (dealing with bor-rowing powers of states) of the Constitution has not been so far the subject to any authoritative interpretation by this Court, in our considered opinion, the aforesaid questions squarely fall within the ambit of Article 145(3) of the Constitution". Besides, it also raises "various questions of significant importance impact ing the Federal Structure of Governance as embedded in ou Constitution", the court said, re ferring the matter to a five-judg Constitution bench.

The court said it had applied the three-pronged test of prima facie case, balance of convenience and irreparable injury, to

ience and irreparable injury, of determine Kerala's interim relief claim and said the "State has failed to establish" its case. 

Why SC barred unregulated soil extraction for linear projects

THE SUPREME Court has set aside a notification issued by the Environment Ministry three years ago that exempted extraction of ordinary earth for linear projects, such as

ordinary earth for linear projects, such as road and railways construction, from obtaining Environmental Clearance (EC). The exemption, offered in March 2020, was challenged before the National Green Tribunal (NCT), which asked the Ministry in October 2020 to review it within three months. As the Ministry dragged its feet, the matter reached the top court, which on March 21 this year struck down the "blanket" and "arbitrary" exemption.

The 2020 exemption

In September 2006, the Environment Ministry had issued a notification under The Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, on ac-tivities that would require prior EC. In January 2016, a second notification was isempting certain categories of proj-

The third notification of March 2020 added "Extraction or sourcing or borrowing of ordinary earth for the linear projects such as roads, pipelines, etc" to the list of exempted activities.

The Centre argued before the NGT that the exemption was necessary for the aid of gen-eral public", and would help "the kumhars (potters), farmers, gram panchayats, vanjara, oads of Gujarat", and all non-mining activities identified by the states. It also said that grant of exemption was a policy matter that did not warrant judicial interference.

The general purpose of the 2020 notifica-n was to conform to the amendments made to the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957, in March 2020, allowing new lessees to continue mining for two years with the statutory clearances and licences is-sued to their predecessors.

Grounds for challenge

The exemption was challenged before the NGT on the ground that allowing the ex-traction of earth indiscriminately was arbi-

trary and violative of Article 14 of the Constitution of India. The petitioner argued that the exemption violated the requirement of prior EC in the leases as laid down by the top court in Deepak Kumar versus the

State of Haryana (2012). It was submitted that the Ministry had circunwented the legal procedure of inviting public objections before issuing the 2020 notification by wrongly exercising its powers to do away with such requirements "under the garb of public interest during the Covid-19 national lockdown...to serve

and further the interest of pri-vate miners and contractors".

In October 2020, the NGT held that the In October 2020, the NGT held that the Ministry "should strike a balance and instead of being a blanket exemption, it needs to be hedged by appropriate safeguards such as the process of excavation and quantum". The Tribunal asked the Centre to "revisit" the no-tification within three months.

"It is also not provided that only that quantity of ordinary earth, which is required to implement the linear projects, is exempted," the court said, adding that exemption granted without incorporating any safeguards defeats the purpose of the EP Act.

Second, the court held that the Ministry offered no justification for concluding "that in the public interest, the requirement of public notice should be dispensed with" at any stage — neither in the notification itself nor in its submissions to the NGT and SC. The decision was made without any application

decision was made without any application of the mind, it said.

Third, even the August 2023 notification, the court said, failed to elaborate on the concept of linear projects, specify the authority responsible for environmental safeguards or provisions for the same, or impose restrictions on the quantum of extraction. "The notification was issued two days after the nationwide lockdown was imposed. The work of linear principers such as

arter the nationwide lockdown was imposed...The work of linear projects, such as roads, pipelines, etc, had come to a grinding halt...We fail to understand the undue haste shown by the Central Government in issuing the impugned notification," the

long period.
Currently, it houses a spectrum of advanced instruments like a White light Active Region Monitor (WARM), with calcium and sodium filters to make full disc simultane-

sodium filters to make full disc simultane-ous observations of the photosphere and chromosphere layers of the Sun. The KoSO's rich data repository could help reconstruct the Sun's past and link its behavioural changes to understand and pre-dict its future impact.

Central bank must learn from the past and plan for the challenges it could encounter in the years to come

HILE CENTRAL BANKS in developed countries can be traced as far back as the 17th century, among developing countries, the Reserve Bank of India, established on April 1, 1935, is one of the oldest such institutions. The RBI, as Prime Minister Narendra Modi pointed out at the opening ceremony of RBI@90 in Mumbai, has witnessed both the pre- and post-Independence eras. Since it came into existence, it has navigated and managed the several transitions the country has undergone — from a time when the planning process held sway to a more market-oriented economy, and now an increasingly displaced conomy. As it looks towards the next 10 years, the RBI must learn from its past, adjust and adapt, and plan for the challenges it could encounter on its journey towards its centenary.

In the past nine decades, the Indian economy and the RBI have faced many difficult

moments. In the more recent past, these include the global financial crisis of 2008, the taper fantrum of 2013, demonetisation, and the pandemic induced disruptions to eco-nomic activities. There was also the issue of bad loans plaguing the banking sector. This problem, as the prime minister noted, was tackled by authorities at multiple levels – recognition, resolution and recapitalisation. Prodded by the RBI, banks began to recognise the true extent of the problem. The IBC framework ushered in by the government provided a more effective mechanism for resolving bad loans. Alongside, the govern-ment infused capital in public sector banks. As a consequence, bad loans fell from 11.25 per cent in 2018 to below 3 per cent by September 2023, and credit growth has been healthy. The twin balance sheet problem that held back investment activity has been

resolved, the PM said.

There have been other significant changes in recent times. For one, the central bank has formally adopted inflation targeting. This has helped keep inflation in line with the target and anchor expectations, barring some periods marked by the pandemic induced disruptions. The introduction of UPH has revolutionised the payments ecosystem across the country. Over the coming years, as the pace of change accelerates further, the central bank must prepare for the many challenges that may come before it — from dealing with changes in payment mechanisms, and the central bank digital currency, to new sources of risk and ensuring effective regulation and supervision. It must also be mindful of the risks of unforces nevents An independent central bank halvas actival rule in the macro-risks of unforces nevents An independent central bank natwas critical rule in the macrorisks of unforeseen events. An independent central bank plays a critical role in the macro economic management of the country. Coordination between monetary and fiscal policies is critical for the economy, and for creating a "Viksit Bharat".

Caste atrocity in Alwar school shows endemic nature of a problem that politics and policy need to do more to address

"N THE RUN-UP to elections, as the prime minister speaks of the four castes that matter — the poor, women, youth and farmers — and the main Opposition party, Congress advocates for a nation-wide caste census, on Saturday, an eight-yearold Dalit boy got an early, unwarranted lesson in deeply ingrained inequality. On the premises of a government school in a village in Rajasthan's Alwar, the Class IV stu-dent was assaulted for touching a bucket of water When confronted alnerwards, thea-cused issued casteist slurs and a brazen declaration that he could not be brought to cused issued castests surs and a orazen deciaration that ne could not be prought to book for the incident. The impumity of the act points to a grim and sobering reality: That between the big ideas of social justice and big-ticket ameliorative schemes such as SHRESHTA (Scheme for Residential Education for Students in High Schools in Targeted Arreas) and SHREAY(S (Scholarships for Higher Education for Young Achievers Scheme), aimed to make classrooms more equal spaces, caste violence remains an everyday reality in the country

ality in the country.

The data released in December last year by the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) for the year 2022 underlines the increasing vulnerability of Dalits in India to caste-based violence. In 2022, a total of 57.82 cases were registered for crimes against Scheduled Castes (SCs), an increase of 13.1 per cent over the previous year. Crimes against Scheduled Tribes (STs) saw an increase of 14.3 per cent over those registered in 2021. Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan and Bihar recorded the highest number of crimes against Sc. Behind the cold, hard numbers, some of the human faces of this discrimination included a 15-year-old SC behind the cold. boy in UP's Auraiya who died after being beaten by an upper-caste teacher for an alleged spelling mistake in September 2022, a nine-year-old in Raiasthan's Jalore who succumbed to injuries inflicted by an upper-class teacher for drinking water from a pot meant for up-

r-caste teachers.

Even taking into account the fact that there is now an increase in the number of complaints being registered, this points to a glaring dissonance between the vision of a viksi and atmanirbhar Bharat and the ground reality. While both the Centre and the Opposition speak of justice and empowerment, a lot more needs to be done, in terms of institution alising and increasing sensitisation and safeguards, to address this entrenched injustice

DOGS LIKE US

There is growing evidence of canine vocabulary and intelligence. But what about other thinking animals?

HERE ARE TWO ways, broadly, that human beings view their relationships with canis familiaris. Some people still use the vocabulary of property, of being "masters" of their canine companions—a throwback perhaps from when ing "masters" of their canine companions — a throwback pernaps from when does a part from being friends, were working animals far more widely than they are today. At the other extreme are those for whom their pets are very human, members of the family with appropriate kinsibij terms and relationships. For example, in a nuclear family with a pet, the parents will be mummy and papa (or whatever appellation is used in the home), and the children will be siblings to the dog. This set of people often claim, to the chappin of their less dog devoted friends, that their 'child' can understand everything they say, that he is smarter than the average person. As it turns out, they might be more right than wrong.

As early as 2011, researchers found that dogs knew the names of many more specific

objects and people than previously thought. One border collie called Chaser learned well over 1,000 names. Now, a new study, published in Current Biology, looked at the brain wave activity to establish exactly what dogs are thinking when they seem to recognise balls, frisbees, their favourite toy or your favourite shoe, chewed to bits. The results, sim-ply put, show evidence of object recognition.

There are at least two implications that follow from the study and other similar findings. First, when the pooch gives a blank stare after destroying the latest household item, she might be falking it: The study also found that they can recognise words and choose to ignore them. The second is more ethical and goes beyond the canine kingdom. Elephants, dolphins and whales, primates and great apes — multiple non-human species — have soopsing and winder, printed and great ages — interplet non-interminal spects — inter-shown signs of emotion and intelligence. Few of them — compared to dogs — have been pets, or ever had human "masters". As more animals seem more like people, it might be time to humanise them — just like dogs.

LPF is an expression that doesn't apply in sportsor wars. It cannot be anybody's case that only two teams that are equally matched should play against each other. In cricket, bome teams are known to tailor the pitch to their advantage but this "unfair practice" is rundeingly conduced because the visitine or rundeingly conduced because the visitine. grudgingly condoned because the visiting teams await their turn. Similarly, it is not conteams await their turn. Similarly, it is not considered unfair if a mighty army pummels a tiny opposition in combat. Everything, they say, is fair in love and war. No wonder the phrase "Fair is Foul, Foul is Fair" has confounded human beings, pointing to the possibility of the truth being the opposite of what it might appear to be.

Why is it, then, that LPF should be a sacred
precept for free and fair elections? One reason
could be that an election in a democracy is neither a war nor an amorous contest. A vote is meant to be a social con-tract based on faith and facts. In order for this contest to be fair, the avail-ability of IPF is considered a size qua mon dur-ing elections even if it is acknowledged that the the contestants in other wise.

the contestants might not be equal otherwise. It is neither for the political parties nor for the candidates themselves to even out the field by not trying to be one-up on each other. If inher-

If inher-ent inequality is recognised sap art of the game, it is the regulator's responsibility to ensure that there is LPF during elections when they en-deavour to influence the voters in their favour. A closer look at the application of this prin-ople of LPF shows that the "leveling" is spe-cific to the advantage that the ruling partyen-joys via svis Opposition candidates. That is at the heart of the feeling that the field is "unlev-leder" In soor stehe wakes treamming to conelled". In sports the weakest team might con-test against the strongest. Although there are common laws to gov-ern ordinary civic behaviour in normal times, political parties and candidates are expected to observe a certain decorum during elections, which they have voluntarily agreed to under the superintendence of the EC. Not all the pre-scribed testrain is estrictive in cercibed in laws. scribed restraint is strictly inscribed in law Sometimes it is a mark of their commitment to decent public behaviour; at others, it is a display of the EC's even-handed approach

display of the EC's even-handed approach. That indeed is the genesis of the MCC that the EC is expected to enforce during elections. A scrutiny of the MCC shows that there are four principal players covered by the Code; candidates, political parties, ruling party of brueauracy. The last two are part of the rul-ing dispensation but the code applies to them separately too. The bulk of the code coversio-lations otherwise covered in law, such as, not "agontate existing differences or create." to "aggravate existing differences or create mutual hatred or cause tension between dif mutual hatred or cause tension between dif-ferent castes and communities, 'orn tot level 'unwerified allegations' and launch personal criticism, or not appealing 'to caste or com-munal feelings for securing votes', or parties and candidates not resorting to 'corrupt parties and their workers will not disrupt the activities of 'nal parties. There are sections or campaign meetings, processions, polling booths and election manifestos.

The noteworthy thing, however, is that the MCC devotes a separate section on the "party in power whether in the Centre or state", enin power whether in the Centre or stale*, en-joining it to "ensure that no cause is given for any complaint that it has used its official po-sition for the purposes of its election cam-paign*. The misuse, as covered by the Code, is essentially pertaining to the use of govern-ment facilities such as guest houses, transport or public infrastructure, and the use of its au-thority to utilise public funds for issuing ad-vertisements or granting new sanctions. The MC Closest' no beyond this

MCC doesn't go beyond this.

The routine functioning of the state ma-

chinery and the legal system is in no way re-stricted by the letter of the current MCC. It is a moot point if it is even desirable for the EC to interfere in the due process of law such as court hearings, or whether routine investigation by law enforcement agencies be subject to adjudication by the EC, as it might make the

to adjudication by the EC, ast might make the situation more untenable. Perhaps, misuse of authority by state agencies was not even concived of lagged by the stakeholders when the MCC was initially drafted.

The MCC, however, is an evolving document just as human behaviour is. Cognisant of this, in the wake of the Ceneral Elections in 2009, the EC vide its letter dated March 19, 2009, clarified that the applicability of the MCC extended to commissions such as the Electricity Regulatory Commissions, which are statutory autonomous bodies discharging Electricity Regulatory Commissions, which are statutory autonomous bodies discharging their authority under an Act. Daniel Kahneman alerted us to inherent biases. With effort, they can be overcome

THE MOST IMPORTANT lessons about life are not taught in school or college. Or, as Oscar Wildesaid, 'Education is an admirable thing, but it is well to member from time to time that nothing that is worth knowing can be taught.' How to navigate human relationships, manage personal finances, handle organisational dysfunction, deal with winning and losing, make important decisions including who to mary and who to wel for, how to overcome our own very human frailities—most of us muddle our way through these highly consequential aspects of life. Daniel Kalnheman, who died on March 27, was a psychologist who won the Nobel Prize in Economics, pretty much creating the field

in Economics, pretty much creating the field of behavioural economics along the way, with fellow traveller Amos Tversky, But his impact eniow travener armos reversity, but in simple in teaching us how to think about thinking and thereby finding answers to the most important questions that impact our lives—is perhaps his most lasting and valuable legacy. Kalmeman's central message could not be more clear or more critical. Left to our own devices, we are likely to make judgements and take decisions based on fallactes, delusions

take decisions based on fallacies, delusions and systematic biases. If we want to make be-ter decisions in our personal lives and as a so-ciety, we need to be aware of our biases and find ways to work around them. Kahneman's view of the human condi-tion was a traje cone. His work demon-strated that we are all, without exception,

The importance of hope

Reversing the decline in fertility, predicted in recent studies, isn't impossible. Policies that instil hope in young people could help



NOT SO LONG ago, we were fed with terri-NOT SO LONG ago, we were fed with terri-fying projections of a population "time bomb" which would overwhelm our coun-try, and the world, depleting all its resources and leaving everyone impoverished. We were exhorted to trim our family size for the sake of the country — no more than two children and just one would be truly patri-otic. China went further: Those who had more than one child were subjected to shame and stiff penalties It is remarkable. shame and stiff penalties. It is remarkable how the narrative has flipped.

how the narrative has flipped.

The publication of a paper on global population trends in the Lancer last week is only the latest to project that the population "time bomb" staring us in the face is in the exact opposite direction. Now, it appears that the world's population is likely to shrink precipitously in most countries, including India. China is projected to lose up to half its current population by 2100. Only sub-Saharan Africa will buck this trend—in this not-too-distant future, one in two children born in the world will be African,

—in this not-too-distant future, one in two children born in the world will be African, ironically much like our remote past when people from the continent dominated our planet.

Of course, many of us will not live long enough to experience this shrinking world. We must also pause for a moment to acknowledge that all modelled estimates of population are based on assumptions which do not account for unexpected shifts in social norms, such as those that have led to reductions in the estimated number of which do not account for unexpected shifts in social norms, such as those that have led to reductions in the estimated number of people on our planet in the future. So, the best way to interpret these estimates is as a warming that, if we don't do anything to understand and address the factors behind declining fertility, populations are going to shrink. This is alarming primarily because the losses will be entirely due to fewer births. This, in turn, paints a dystopic picture — a world increasingly populated by old people. Neighbourhoods, once filled with the laughter of Kids playing could now be dominated by the staccato of walking sticks. And who will then support the legions of older people who are not only be productive but also in greater need of health and social care resources?

There are many theories about why fertility is falling, even in countries where religion from you not contraception. A common theory is that education and women's empowement are key factors, a dong with

empowerment are key factors, along with the increasing probability of child survival. This theory argues that, as women have Ints treory argues that, as women have greater agency and certainty about the survival of their children, they opt for smaller families. But it falls to answer why so many women, and couples, are opting not to have any children at all. In many countries, such as the US, the largest changes in family size have not just been amongst those who have three or more children but also those who have seen children but also those who ro children.

It does not explain why fertility is falling even amongst wealthier segments of the population who have no financial constraints. Indeed, a recent analysis found that the effects of pronatal policies, such as childcare subsidies and extended parental leave and tax incentives, on fertility rates are very small. try's youth were amongst the unhappiest of all. And, several international bodies have downgraded India's democracy to being "partially free" or "flawed" or as an "electoral autocracy".

Why would anyone want to start a fam-ily in such a bleak scenario?

That said, the demographic changes that are being predicted are not inevitable. Inatsaul, the demographic changes that are being predicted are not inevitable. Policies such as promoting women's education have led to a reduction in fertility. Fertility too can be stabilised. To do so, in a nutshell, policies need to restore hope in young people. More immediately, policies need to be framed to not squander India's much-vaunted demographic dividend of being home to the largest number of young people in the world.

A hopeful future lies in a more equal and compassionate country — this can be realised through progressive taxation, bolstering labour and social security, pension laws, and parental and retirement benefits. A hopeful future is a more caring country, one where universal health coverage is truly universal and offeres high-quality long-term care for persons living with chronic conditions.

We should be prepared for the inevitable surge in the numbers of older peodratable surgers.

An imperfect farm solution

Farmers need to be supported. But seeking a legally-guaranteed MSP without debating all its complications could do more harm than good



EARLIER THIS MONTH, farmers were on the streets again to demand a legally-guar-anteed minimum support price (MSP). The agitation, centred around politics in Punjab, in Erzled out as the unions were riddled with factionalism. However, debates about legally-guaranteed MSP or its impracticality continue to linger. In trying to avoid forestimating the property of the ity continue to linger. In trying to avoid for-menting differences amongs those seek-ing such an MSP, many unresolved issues have been bushed under the rug. These, I fear, might become contentious later, Seeking "legally-guaranteed MSP" before developing a broader consensus and think-ing through its operating mechanism, is like putting the cart before the bullook. MSP is a price calculated by the govern-ment for different crops, some of which it procures for its food security buffer stocks, redistributing to the poor, mitigating infla-

procures for its food security buffer stocks, redistributing to the poor, mitigating inflation and stabilising prices. In the process, farmers get financial support. Therefore, no government is likely to stop announcing MSP and procuring crops at this support price. Legally guaranteed MSP has largely come to signify the right of the farmer to receive this value.

There is no unanimity amongst though several processing legally-unaranteed MSP on several real value.

There is no unaimity amongst those seeking legally-guaranteed MSP on severalissues. Though the number of farmers benefiting from MSP has increased by more than 50 per cent in the last 10 years, such farmers remain a small minority. Sammers who grow creals will be happy to settle for legal provisions for the 23 crops for which MSP is currently available. These comprise only about 28 per cent of the country's total agricultural produce covered. Academics too and elivided. — ma parucular area, a tarmer would be incentivised to grow the crops best suited to the block's agno-climatic conditions. Farmers growing paddy will not want to shift to other crops as the alternatives can never be as profitable. On the other hand,

a legal enactment would result in support for and procurement of different crops expanding exponentially across India. Therefore, it is only logical, given the increased cost and scale of interventions, that interventions would be for limiter produce (five acres worth) per farmer family. 

to its video conferencing. Rivals, however, said packaging the products together gives Microsoft an unfair advantage. The company started selling the two products separately in the EU and Switzerland on October 1

"To ensure clarity for our customers, we are extending the steps we took last year to unbundle Teams from M365 and O365

dle Teams from M365 and 0365 in the European Economic Area and Switzerland to customers globally," a Microsoft spokespersonsaid.

"Doing so also addresses feedback from the European Commission by providing multi-national companies more flexibility when they want to standardise their purchasing across geographies."
Microsoft said in a blogpost that it was introducing a new lineup of commercial Microsoft 365 and Office 365 suites that do not include Teams in regions outside the EEA (European Economic Area) and Switzerland, and also a new standalone Teams offering for standalone Teams offering for Enterprise customers in those

regions.
Starting April 1, customers can either continue with their current licensing deal, renew, update or witch to the new offers.
For new commercial customers, prices for Office without Teams range from \$7.75 to \$54.75 depending on the product while Teams Standalone will cost \$5.25.

While Praggis 14th in the FIDE charts with arting 0.7246. Culest his 16th with 2743. The 29-year-old Vidit is 25th with 2727 points.

India needs unlikely Gopichand-Padukone alliance in Paris medal pursuit

FIRST, THE dire alarmist scenario: There might be no Olympic medal in badminton from the Paris Games for India. So the perennial gripe, intrigue, petty politics and tensions of which stake-hold-

ers get credit for a medal's success might not play out amidst that no-medal silence; and absolutely no one will be happy with this scenario. Supporting NGOs, central tnis scenario. Supportring NGOs, central funders in Delh, parents, support staff and coaches – both childhood and elite – might have little to celebrate because the Paris badminton medals are very tough to nail down. It's because everyone doesn't always pull in the same direction.

Now, an unlikely but ideal scenario: the

three big coaches Pullela Gopichand, Vimal Kumar and Prakash Padukone, pool in their brains to help HS Prannoy, Lakshya Sen and PV Sindhu give the medal a proper go.

Every Indian shuttler headed to Olympics needs not only the soothing words of their mentors, but the eagle eye of a critic or nitpicker who can objectively hanlyse and point out if there's scope for improvement. It's not out it there's stoppe for improvement. It's not even about many cooks having a go at the broth, but just some garnish here, and some tempering there. The supportive teams can do with a dash of brutal honesty at this stage of

preparation.
Boe, Padukone and Gopichand along with Vimal are all experienced professionals with fascinatingly incisive badminton brains and above petty upmanship now, having etched legacies that can't be erased.

Politics, mistrust and routinely insti Politics, mistrust and routinely instigated foment can spice up rivalies alright. And the player-coach tensions might offer popcorn accompaniments to the uninvested gossipy swathes. But the Paris Cames could do with some pan-India plotting against the Chinese, Japanese, Danes and Indonesians by a united badminton brain, fill allearn to trust.

There are three medals possible, but it could even be zero. So, nail down the medals first, we can devote reams to who gets credit later.
